- 1. Permit Hearing on the following **Operating Permit Amendment Application**:
- One (1) existing Operating permit for James H. Johnson:

Well #1 (BVDO-0308) Located at: N 30.845314° W 96.549168° 0.58 miles SE of the intersection of Old Hearne Road and SH-6 in Robertson County. Total maximum annual production from the water well is 100 ac-ft/yr at a maximum rate of 150 gpm for Agricultural use. Permit holder seeks to amend the existing permit increasing the maximum production rate to 200 gpm. The well produces from the Carrizo Aquifer.

- 2. Discussion and possible action on the following **Operating Permit Amendment Application**:
- One (1) existing Operating permit for James H. Johnson:
