Well #1 (**BVHU-0302 & BVOP-0134**) Located at: N 31.34861389° W 96.34220278° 2.82 miles NE of the intersection of FM 937 and Sterling Robertson Dam Road in Robertson County. Total maximum annual production from the water well is 40.32 ac-ft/yr at a maximum rate of 60 gpm for Retail Public Water Supply use. Permit holder seeks to amend the existing permits increasing the maximum production rate of the well from 60 gpm to 115 gpm. No additional water production is being requested. The well produces from the Simsboro Aquifer.
